Guidelines for Oral Presentation

The purpose of the 5th NCL-RF Annual Student Conference Oral presentation sessions is to communicate research from the lab to learners by research scholars, predoctoral, postdoctoral fellows, and expert data users.

Here are a few guidelines to be followed for the Oral presentation:

1. All presenters must adhere to the time given for the presentation (7 min for the presentation and 2 min for Q & A)
2. Slides should be clear and visible
3. The evaluation will be based on the following aspects of your presentation
 - **Organization of the talk**
Introduction, Body, Summary, Reference to Other Work, Other Aspects
 - **Clarity in the talk**
Definition of Problem, Diction, Use of Visual Aides, Inflection, Poise, Projection, Other Aspects
 - **Presentation slides**
Layout and organization, Density of Information, Illustration of critical points
 - **Content**
Significance, Originality, Novelty, Level of Sophistication, Logical Cogency, Other Aspects
 - **Question and Answers**
